

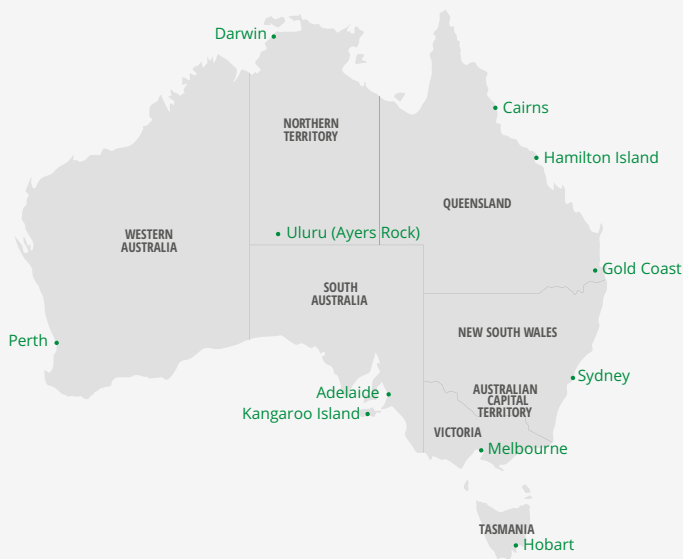

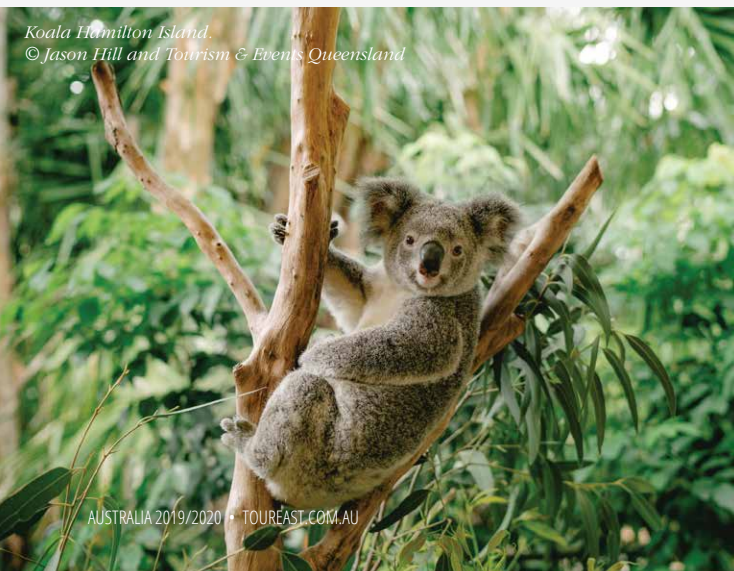

## DAY 1 ARRIVE SYDNEY

## DAY 2 SYDNEY

Today you'll enjoy a private guided panoramic **city tour of Sydney + Sydney Harbour lunch cruise**. Discover this beautiful city and harbour area including - Sydney Harbour Bridge, Sydney Opera House, the historic Rocks area, the Royal Botanic Gardens, Hyde Park & Mrs Macquarie's Chair. The tour continues through the Eastern suburbs - Watsons Bay and world-famous Bondi Beach and concludes at Circular Quay where your harbour lunch cruise awaits. Enjoy a buffet lunch and visit Sydney's star attractions. The rest of the afternoon is free to relax and explore the city before returning to your hotel.

### THE BLUE MOUNTAINS

## DAY 3 BLUE MOUNTAINS

This morning your guide will pick you up from your hotel for a full-day private tour of the **Blue Mountains & Featherdale Wildlife Park**. The tour includes entry to Scenic World to ride on the **Scenic Railway, Skyway and Cableway**. Be amazed by the beauty of this remote and lush rainforest as you experience a thrilling descent on the world's steepest railway, walk among the forest, ride the cableway and glide between cliff tops on the amazing Skyway. The tour includes lunch at a local restaurant and finally a visit to Featherdale Wildlife park to see some of the local animals in their natural habitat. ## ULURU

Also known as Ayers Rock, Uluru is a massive sandstone monolith that towers above the surrounding landscape. It is sacred to Indigenous Australians and is part of the Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park that also includes the 36 red-rock domes of the Kata Tjuta. Your clients will be dazzled by the changing colour of Uluru at sunrise and sunset.

## DAY 5 SYDNEY TO AYERS ROCK

Your private vehicle awaits to take you to the airport for your flight. On arrival in Ayers Rock a courtesy shuttle will take you to your hotel, your base for the next 2 nights. Enjoy an unforgettable evening eating beautifully prepared food under the sparkling outback sky at the Sounds of Silence Dinner experience. While dining in the middle of the Australian desert you'll be dazzled by the sunset over Uluru.

## DAY 6 AYERS ROCK/ULURU

You wake early this morning and with a small tour group and your driver-guide head for the spectacular sunrise at Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. Watch the desert come alive as you travel through the remote landscape bound for the special viewing area to watch the sunrise while enjoying your picnic breakfast. Spend some time in the area, walk among the mighty rock walls and learn about the cultural significance of the park to the local Anangu people. Afterwards you'll return to your hotel to relax for a few hours before your afternoon desert experience.

In the afternoon you'll return to Kata Tjuta National Park with your driver-guide. On arrival walk around and among the folds of the rock as your guide explains the history and cultural significance of the area. Afterwards sip sparkling wine and enjoy light refreshments as you watch the sunset over Uluru, before returning to your hotel.

## DAY 8 CRUISE TO MICHAELMAS CAY IN THE GREAT BARRIER REEF ABOARD THE OCEAN SPIRIT

Set sail aboard a luxury 32 metre sailing catamaran, Ocean Spirit (English-speaking crew), to pristine Michaelmas Cay - a low-lying vegetated sand cay encircled by a beautiful reef teeming with colourful marine life. The area is also a protected sanctuary for migratory seabirds. Snorkel from the cay's shallow waters and cruise in the semi-submersible for a diver's view. Homeward bound enjoy a glass of sparkling wine.

**Inclusions:** morning & afternoon tea, buffet lunch, environmental charge, snorkel equipment, marine biologist presentations, guided nature tours of the island and bird sanctuary.

## DAY 9 CAIRNS TO KURANDA RAINFOREST VILLAGE

With a private driver-guide you'll depart early in the morning bound for Kuranda. First stop is Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park where you'll learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, enjoy a corroboree celebration, dance performances, and a fire-making ceremony. Learn about bush food, bush medicine, hunting & weapons. Experience a didgeridoo presentation and take a boomerang and spear throwing lesson. After lunch journey through the World Heritage-listed rainforest on the **Skyrail Rainforest Cableway** - a 7.5 km gondola ride over the forest canopy for panoramic views of Cairns and the glittering Coral sea.



After a stop in the rainforest village, continue on the **Kuranda Scenic Railway** – an unforgettable rail journey through the village in the rainforest passing spectacular waterfalls and Barron Gorge. The tour ends at Freshwater station, where you'll be met for your return hotel transfer. Variety of languages available.

Visit Federation Square – a strikingly modern venue in the CBD for arts, culture and public events, the MCG (Melbourne Cricket Ground) - a world-famous sports stadium, St Patrick's Cathedral, Albert Park Lake (Formula 1) and St Kilda Beach. The day ends at Eureka Skydeck 88 where you can take in a complete 360-degree view of the city, the sports precinct, Port Phillip Bay, the beautiful Dandenong Ranges and the Yarra Valley. ### ADELAIDE

South Australia's capital with its calendar of festivals and special events has it all, including spacious boulevards, sophisticated architecture and lush gardens. ## DAY 2 ADELAIDE TO KANGAROO ISLAND

Today begin your **2 day/1-night tour of Kangaroo Island**. By cruise travel from Adelaide to Kangaroo Island. First stop is Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery to enjoy a 2-course lunch at Vivonne Bay Bistro. The next stop is Seal Bay Conservation Park where together with a Park Ranger you'll walk among Australian sea lions. From here you'll continue to the In-Flight Birds of Prey display at Raptor Domain, followed by a visit to 'KI' Wildlife Park to get up close with koalas, see penguins swim and play, hand feed kangaroos and wallabies, and interact with snakes, crocodiles and reptiles. 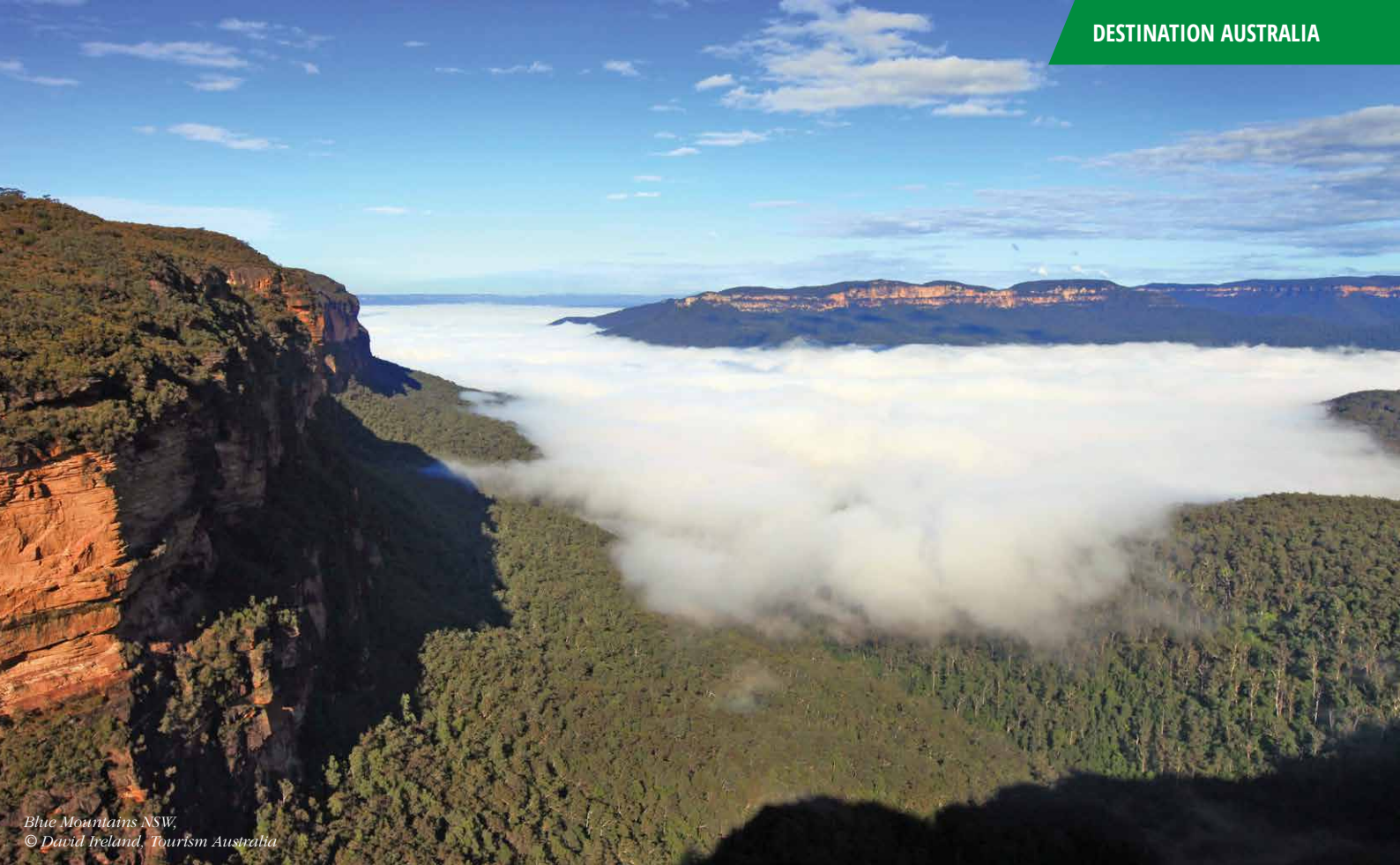

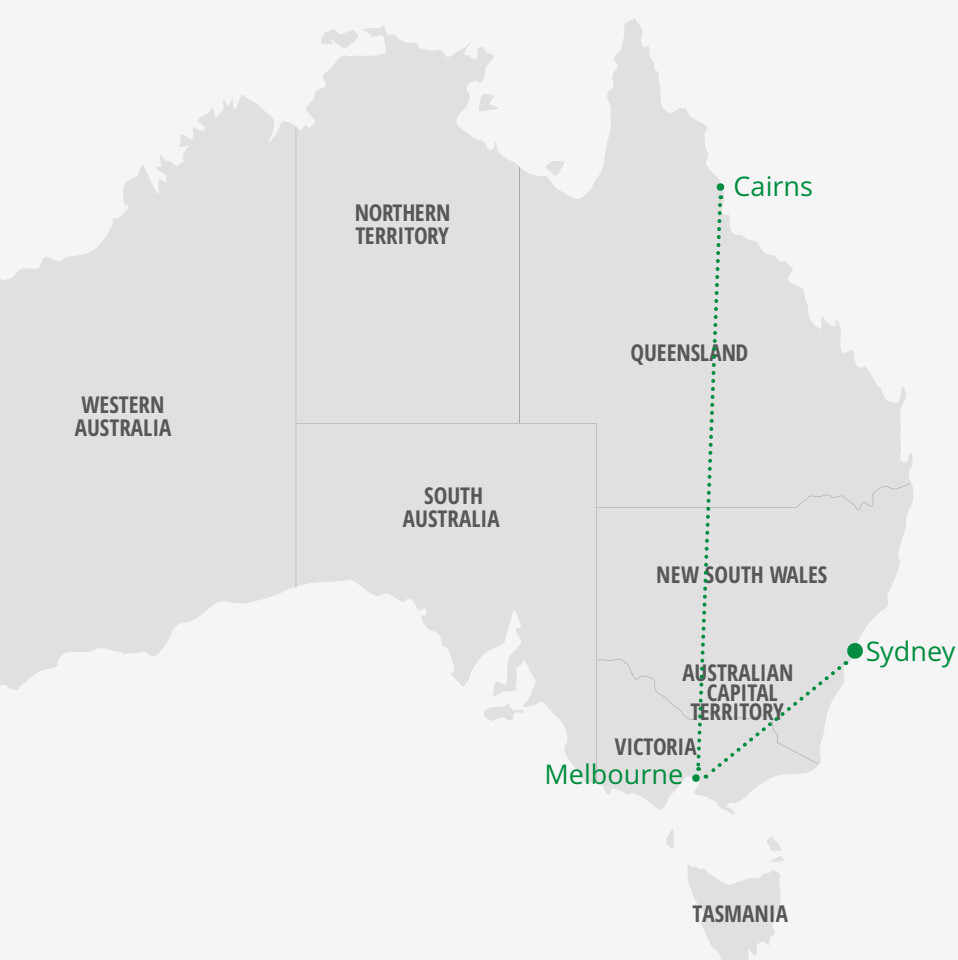

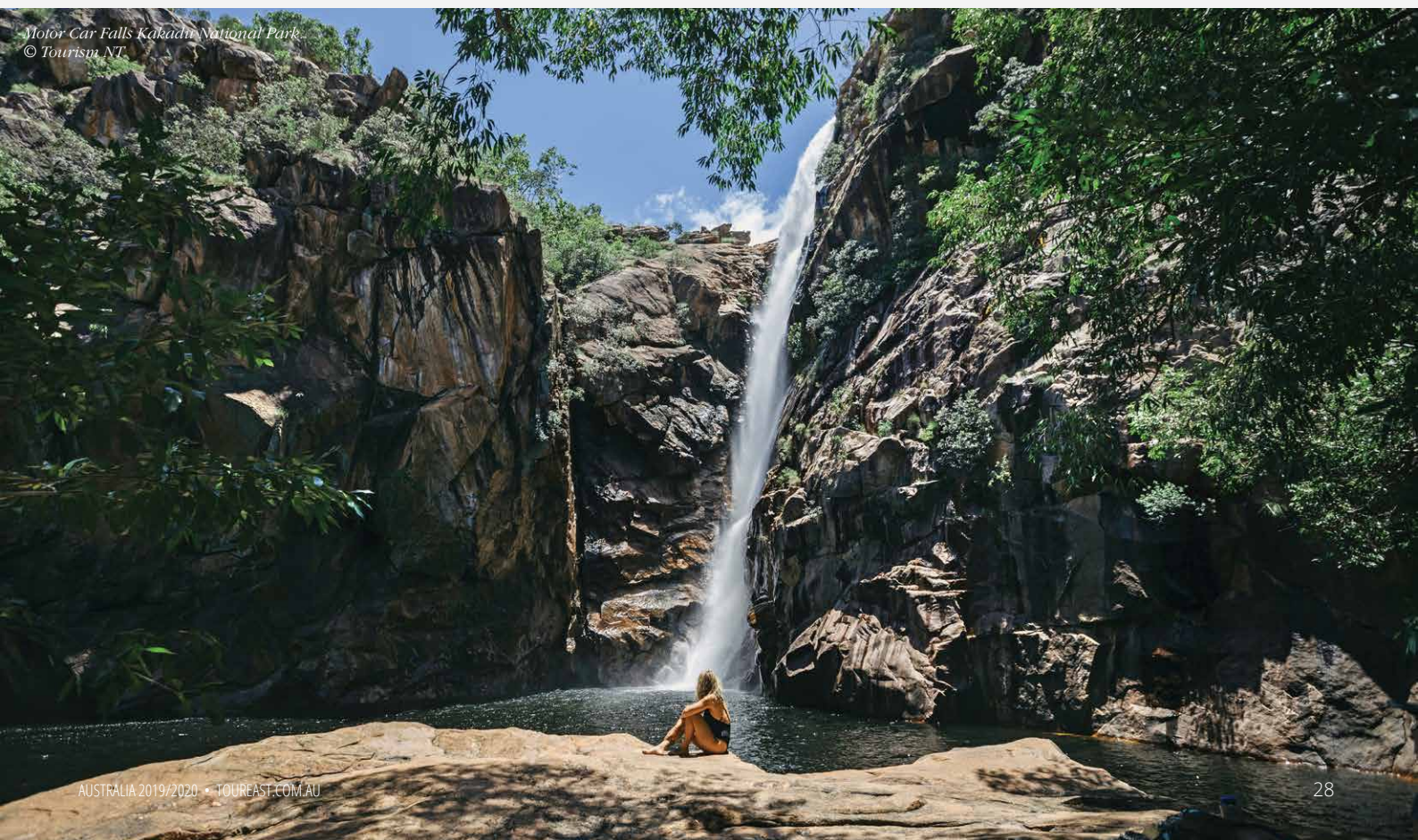

Tours in English run daily from 9am-5pm with a maximum group size of 35 people (Tours in different languages run on special days and hours). There are over 200 stairs included on the tour; if you have limited mobility there is a daily 12pm Access Tour.
